NEW GROUP FOR DEAFBLIND LIVING IN CO. CORK & CO. KERRY.



A new group for individuals who are deafblind is being set up in Cork. This group is open to people from Co. Cork and Co. Kerry.

The first meeting will be held on **Wednesday March 21st from 11am to 1pm** & the group hopes to meet 4 times a year in Cork.

Meetings will be facilitated by the Policy & Advocacy Lead of the **Anne Sullivan Centre** and will be held at **Cork Deaf Association**. The Anne Sullivan Foundation will provide funding for an ISL interpreter where one is requested. Individuals who are deafblind and their family members are invited to participate in the meetings

The Advocacy Working Group provides individuals who are deafblind with the opportunity to meet up, get to know one another and work together on advocacy projects with a view to increasing recognition of deafblindness in Ireland and influencing the development of support services.
